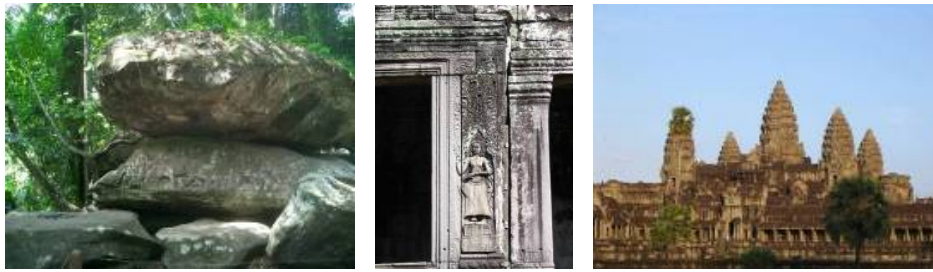

En route, discover Phnom Bros and Phnom Srei khmer temples (better known as the Killing Fields during the Khmer Rouge era) before visiting Wat Nokor, an Angkorian temple (12<sup>th</sup> century) housing a colorful modern pagoda. Then enjoy a city orientation tour of Kompong Cham with its fine colonial architecture. Take lunch at a local restaurant in Kompong Cham.

Continue towards Kompong Thom. On the way, visit Wat Kohar Nokor, built in the 11<sup>th</sup> century during the reign of Suryavarman I, and the nearby village with its monastery. Later stop at Phum Prasat with its pre-Angkorian tower within the compound of the village pagoda.

Upon arrival in Kompong Thom, check-in at your hotel.

### **Day 4 KOMPONG THOM / SIEM REAP (B/L)**

Visit Angkor Wat (early-mid 12<sup>th</sup> century) dedicated to the Hindu god Vishnu. This huge temple-mountain, built by King Suryavarman II is considered as the masterpiece of Khmer architecture and art.

### **Day 6 SIEM REAP (B)**

After breakfast, explore the monastic complex of Preah Khan whose name means Sacred Sword, the small island temple of Neak Pean, and then Ta Som. These three temples were built by King Jayavarman VII and illustrate the preeminence of Mahayana Buddhism during his reign. Continue to the twin temples of Thommanon and Chau Say Tevoda (early 12<sup>th</sup> century), the unfinished temple-mountain of Ta Keo, the Srah Srang holy pond, Bantey Kdei and then the scenic Ta Prohm monastery, enveloped by jungle.

Overnight in Siem Reap.

**Day 7 SIEM REAP / POIPET (B)**

After breakfast, departure to Poipet border gate with Thailand (155 km, around 4 hours drive).
