## DAY 2

- ❑ Buffet breakfast at Leisure in the Hotel Restaurant
  - ❑ **9:00 AM:** Orientation tour of the city of Buenos Aires. The tour will introduce the visitor to the beautiful parks and gardens of Palermo, the old quarters of San Telmo, the bustling banking and business centres and the historical Government House, Congress and the Recoleta Cemetery. Recoleta is a wonderful walking area with elegant French-style buildings that combines upscale stores, restaurants, sidewalk cafés and boutiques. The cemetery occupies four blocks and the famous Evita Peron is buried here. Sculptures and vaults made by national and foreign artists can be seen in this cemetery, where the most illustrious families are buried. They will hear about the immigrants who came from Europe, the politics that swayed emotions, changed lives and became the theme of stories, music and theatre. (Duration 4 hrs)
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- ❑ **Lunch at Costanera Riverside**

After the tour, lunch at one of the several restaurants overlooking the River along the "Costanera"Riverside Avenue. This is one of the most colourful areas of Buenos Aires chosen by many locals to have a relaxed lunchtime. *(Table d'hote menu; half-bottle of house-wines per person; mineral water; soft-drinks included. Welcome to Buenos Aires, the city of TANGO !!! TANGO'S HISTORY

The story of tango begins just as the last century was ending. The whole Rio de la Plata region began to receive great waves of European immigrants along with thousands of criollos returning from the Spanish civil war. Most of these settled in the areas around the growing ports of Buenos Aires and Montevideo. The mixture of Italian, Spanish, East European and Jewish newcomers mingled with

the local population itself a mixture of Spanish, Blacks and indigenous Americans. The pulsing rhythms of the candombe that arrived with African slaves mixed with the haunting melodies of Andalusia and Southern Italy and the locally popular milongas. Sometime during the decade of the 1880's a fusion of all these cultural elements occurred and something new - the tango - was born.

Exactly when and where is both a controversy and a mystery, but one thing is certain: its debut did not take place in 'polite company'. The most important gathering place for the popular classes of this period was the brothel. Inevitably the music began to spill out into the

streets. By the time the new century arrived its audience included all but the still disapproving upper classes. In 1917 Victor records captured the voice of young Carlos Gardel, who was to be the tango's first international superstar. What transformed Gardel into a star and tango into music with a far wider appeal, were recordings, radio and the new talking moving pictures. By the time of his death in a plane crash in Colombia in 1935 he had become the personification of tango itself.

- **8:00 PM: Depart from the Hotel for a Dinner & Tango show at "La Esquina de Carlos Gardel"**

At the end of the XIXth. Century when the town of Buenos Aires was trying to become a city and the tango started to spread amongst the locals and immigrants, one of the most picturesque quarters was "El Abasto". A working city during the day and where the tango prevailed during the night.

The Abasto neighbourhood, the main supply market to the city (hence its name, in Spanish, abastecer means to supply) witnessed the rise of a popular idol "Carlos Gardel". He grew up in this area and later became the personification of the tango itself.

Today, more than 100 years later, "Esquina Carlos Gardel" opens its doors in the original site of the restaurant and hotel where Carlos Gardel gathered with his friends to dine and sing.

This tango club and restaurant, decorated in an Art Nouveau style, recreating the sophistication and luxury of the salons of old, with its up to date technology and first class artistic performances, together with a good cuisine, will guarantee an unforgettable night of tango.

## THE GAUCHO

**Gaicho:** The gaicho stands as one of the best known cultural symbols of Argentina. The gaicho is a rough, tough, free-riding horseman of the Pampa, proud cousin of the North American cowboy, and the Australian stockman. He has been elevated to the level of myth celebrated in song and prose, endowed with the virtues of strength, bravery and honour.

The Gaicho life had its beginning on the Pampa, the vast grasslands of the east-central Southern Cove. Their origins trace back to the first decade of the 16th century, shortly after the first settlements in the Rio de la Plata area. Some of the Spanish settlers left the young towns to roam the land they came to conquer, mixing with the Indians, learning their language and traditions, but maintaining their individuality. Being nomads, they rode through the Pampas freely, hunting ostriches with their 'boleadoras' (this weapon consisted of three stones or metal balls attached to the ends of connected thongs. Thrown with phenomenal accuracy the gauchos would trip the legs of the fleeing prey) and carrying all their possessions with them, always on their best and only true friend, their horse. Our gauchos were excellent at riding, taming wild horses, and cattle rearing, but never to ready to settle down to farming. Today very few gauchos are left to roam the vast mountains and Pampas of Argentina. Most have settle and work in 'Estancias' breeding and rearing cattle.

Depart from the Hotel at 10:00 am for an interesting drive into the Pampas, a blend of traditional Gaucho lore and modern agro-industry, the domain of the great land-owners, the home of the first polo players and the wealth of the country. After a 2 hour drive the guests will be welcomed by the owners of "**Los Patricios**". Gauchos riding their best "criollo" horses will escort the visitors from the Estancia gates through the wooded park, to be greeted by the hosts in their beautiful home.

Waiters will serve cold white and red wines, beers and other drinks while the Gauchos prepare the traditional "asado"(barbecue) meal on open fires. Lunch will be served in the shade of the great trees in the park (weather permitting) and the young country boys and girls will entertain with their charming music and dancing. The Gauchos will provide the most exciting spectacle of the day as they show their incredible skills on their Pampa's Ponies. At the end of a thrilling and unusual day of country encounter, **return to the Hotel by 18.00 hours.**

Lunch with renowned Argentine beef and live entertainment by "Gauchos" in their typical dress, dancing to folklore music, will make this a memorable day. Regular Basis. **DIFFERENCE BETWEEN LOS PATRICIOS RANCH AND SANTA SUSANA**

Whatever the final choice is, in both excursions, guests will have the chance of being in contact with the countryside.

The 2nd option (which we call "Fiesta Gaucha") is located in a ranch (privately owned), which can host up to 600 people, and is used for seat-in-bus tours. This means that, perhaps, on the day that we make the reservation, there can be only be a few passengers more, apart from your group, but it is more likely that there will be over 200/300 people. Both, the barbecue lunches and the folklore shows are very good.

Regarding the 1st option (Private Ranch), this is somewhat different. This ranch in the countryside is also privately owned, and the actual owners will host the group. Whilst it will not be of exclusive use either, as there can be other groups on that same day, the owners are more selective with the number of people hosted at the same time, therefore there will never be as many people as at the Fiesta Gaucha.

### **DINNER OPTION**

- **Dine-around Programme:**

Arrangements will be made to dine at one of the various attractive restaurants in the area of Puerto Madero. This is a new development area in Buenos Aires. Part of the old port warehouses on the river were recycled and are now smart office buildings and first class restaurants. Some of the recommended restaurants would be the following:



**BICE:** one of the Bice links throughout the world. Italian cuisine with a slight local touch. Settled next to the river and steps away from Buenos Aires downtown. Built up in a store room which once belonged to the port, the original iron structure contrasting with polished timber create a spacious yet cosy decor. The Italian chef presents a menu including worldwide Bice accents, so it is possible to taste specialities from Bice Tokyo, Bice New York or Bice Milano. Home-made pasta and risotto are the most outstanding preparations but there is also fish and meat dishes.

**KATRINE:** By far one of the better Puerto Madero choices. The salon ensures a professional touch with a relaxed air, an harmonious setting designed with refined and warm ornaments. Katrine's eagle eye in the kitchen and the salon ensures a professional touch in relaxed surroundings. Pasta and fish are the specialities of the house.

**EL MIRASOL:** One of our premier parilla chains. The size of its portions can intimidate the tourist but the quality is top. A meal can start with an "empanada" then dainty entrails, different cuts of meat going with a wide variety of salads. Wines and desserts choices are highly recommended.

**CABAÑA LAS LILAS:** First Class restaurant in very pleasant surroundings serving some of the best Argentine beef.

**HAPPENING:** One of the better 'Parillas' (grilled meats) on the riverfront. The menu offers grill specialities but it also features new flavours and International dishes.

Aproximate cost for a meal with house wines on a set menu basis: based on 30/35 guests per coach including transfers to/from restaurants with one english speaking guide in each coach.

### IGUAZU FALLS



Argentina, Paraguay and Brazil meet where the Iguazu River joins the Parana River in the North-eastern province of Argentina called Misiones. It is here where the Iguazu Falls (Big Water in the local Guarani language) plunges over hard granite into a wide gorge in a series of gigantic waterfalls 2 miles in length and more than 240 feet below. The thunderous roar of crashing water and the multicoloured mist which rises above the falls is natural beauty and grandeur at its best.

- ❑ Arrival at Iguazu airport (IGR). Meet and greet. Transfer in private air-conditioned motorcoach including English-speaking guide to the SHERATON HOTEL. Tips for portorage service at the airport and hotel included.
- ❑ Welcome drink at the hotel on check in.
- ❑ Entrance Fee to the Argentine National Park
- ❑ **Lunch at the hotel.** (Table d`hoté Menu including 3 course meals , soft drinks and half a bottle or red or white wine per person ). Current 21% tax included

Walking tour to the Argentine side of the Iguazu National Park and walk the paths that lead along the lush tropical basin of the Devil's Gorge and over and under the splashing torrents of falling water. Beautiful flowers, ferns, tropical plants, butterflies and exotic birds add to the exciting experience of close contact with nature. A short boat trip will take you up to the pathways leading to the Devil's Gorge, the most impressive of all 270 falls.

Drive to the Brazilian side of the Iguazu National Park and continue on foot visiting the Iguazu River canyon with views of the various falls. Continue down pathways which take you over the falling water up to a special area with a fantastic panoramic view of the Devil's Gorge and the surrounding falls.
- ❑ **Macuco Safari:** Drive along the Macuco Trail in open jeeps for spectacular views of the jungle in all its splendour. Guides will explain some of the stories, marvels and mysteries of the sub-tropical forest surrounded by orchids, bromelias and thousands of butterflies. A short walk down the Iguazu Canyon Trail, penetrating the Brazilian jungle, to visit the Macuco Fall. From there board open boats to sail down the rapids (mild rapids) for a different view of the falls.
- ❑ Entrance Fee to the Brazil National Park
- ❑ Mineral Water or Coca Cola Light during Tour
- ❑ Lunch at restaurant "Canoas", a typical Brazilian restaurant overlooking the Iguazu Falls.

### **SUGGESTED OPTIONAL TOURS IN BUENOS AIRES**

- ❑ **FD TIGRE AND DELTA CRUISE, INCLUDING LUNCH**

The islands of the Tigre area have become a charming place for a day trip, a weekend or a longer visit for those who want to go deep into the slow-moving brownish waters of the Delta along some of its 500 rivers and creeks.

It was first known as the district of the shells (Distrito de las Conchas) as fresh water shells could be found until the early 20<sup>th</sup> Century along the Conchas river, today known as Reconquista.



In 1820, a southeast wind caused the biggest flood ever, turning an insignificant creek then known as Tigre, into an important river able to hold big vessels. Dwellers were relocated and the new settlement was renamed Tigre, in honour of the early presence of jaguars, or American tigers.

Drive through the fashionable riverside suburbs of Olivos, San Isidro, San Fernando to Tigre, with its gracious homes, weeping willows, open air restaurants and cafes,

assorted food vendors, soap-box politics, this is the preferred "playground of the porteños". Continue by motor launch for a leisurely cruise along the waterways and islands of the delta. Cruise past turn of the century stone mansions, English cottages, Italian villas, little wooden shacks painted bright blue and green, ferries, crews practising in outriggers, lonely canoeists, rowing and yacht clubs.

□ **PM - HD CULTURAL TOUR (4hs)- Colon & Fernandez Blanco Museum**

Visit the famous Colon Opera House which will include a visit to the costume workroom, and the Museum of Spanish Art 'Isaac Fernandez Blanco'. This Museum exhibits one of the most important displays of Silverware, furniture, imagery, paintings and porcelain in Latin America.

□ **PM - HD ARCHITECTURE TOUR (3hs )**

The architectural highlights of Buenos Aires seen through its history: The impressive surrounding area of Plaza de Mayo and the few surviving landmarks of the Colonial period; the magnificent public buildings of the early 20<sup>th</sup> century; the best examples of Art Nouveau, Art Deco and Rationalist architecture; the original and colorful houses of la Boca; an Argentinean invention: the "Sausage house" (lodgings of the European immigrants in the neighborhoods); and the contemporary trends in architecture and urban design. A complete introduction to our architectural heritage.
